Spellings

To begin the year, we would like the children to ensure they can spell some key words needed in their writing. They will bring a sheet home to learn, and will be tested on these on Friday 18th September.

After this, spellings will be given out on a Friday, and tested the following week. In order to learn these words, children will need to follow the Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check method, writing the words in the spaces provided.
