The children have really been enjoying our new topic on Conservation. This half term children have been learning about the rainforests. They have been finding out about the different layers of the rainforest, the different animals and plants that live there and how they adapt to their environment. The children have been using atlases and globes to find out where the rainforest are and have been learning about the temperate and climate in these areas.

After half term, the children will be looking more closely at life in the rainforest and the conservation of rainforests. They will be starting a project, which focuses on a story about an imaginative endangered animal. On the back of this letter, you will find an overview showing what children are learning this term.

Our P.E. days are: Rabbits – Monday and Tuesday.
Foxes - Monday and Wednesday.

Please ensure that children have full P.E. kits in school on these days.

Homework:

Children will bring home their spellings every Monday to practice at home. Please spend some time each day going through these with your child. They will be tested on their spellings on the following Monday.

Please listen to your child read every day and sign their reading record every time you hear them read. Children need to have their reading books and records in school every day.

Children will also occasionally have topic or phonics homework. This will be sent home on a Friday with instructions of when they need to complete it. Please check your child's book bag each day for letters and homework.
