

Please could we remind parents yet again that the car park is for staff use only. While you may be 'just dropping off' your child, there is not enough space for everyone to use it and it would not be safe. The signs are very clear.



Who's who?

Do you sometimes wonder why your child's teacher isn't in class?

Does your child talk about members of staff you don't know?

Have you heard that teaching assistants are teaching lessons?

Allow us to explain ...

Class teachers:

- are responsible for all the learning that goes on in class;
- usually produce weekly plans for all English and maths work and most other curriculum subjects;
- know what each child can do, and what they need to learn next;
- have 10% of their teaching time out of the classroom for planning, preparation and assessment (PPA time);
- are in Curriculum Leader Teams that are responsible for a group of subjects across the school.
 Sometimes they visit lessons or talk to children about their work or look at planning to find out how things are going.
- sometimes have to attend trainings or meetings, or support other members of staff.

Student teachers:

- · become part of the teaching team, including being involved in weekly planning meetings;
- work under the direction of a class teacher who remains responsible for the children's learning:
- only teach the class when the teacher feels they are ready to do so.

Higher Level Teaching Assistants:

- have a qualification (or are working towards it) to show that they know how to plan and deliver high quality lessons and make judgements about children's performance;
- know the children well and how they learn, know the teachers well and how they teach, know the school
 well and how we work together;
- cover PPA, planned absences, and unexpected absences in the short-term;
- have regular meetings with a mentor to discuss their planning and their work;
- have half-termly trainings about different aspects of classroom practice.

Cover Supervisors:

- are experienced teaching assistants who sometimes deliver lessons that have been planned by the teacher;
- know the children well and how they learn, know the teachers well and how they teach, know the school well and how we work together;
- cover short-term planned absences and, occasionally, unplanned absences (e.g. if a teacher becomes unwell during the school day).

Teaching Assistants:

- work with groups and individuals;
- work inside the classroom, or in a corridor, or in a quiet room;
- follow a teacher's plans to support children's learning.

Supply teachers:

- work for an agency, not the school:
- · usually deliver the lessons the teacher has already planned;
- do not necessarily know the school, the children or the way the staff work;
- cost a lot of money!! (It would cost over £1,000 per week to cover PPA time)

At Roydon Primary School, we believe that drawing on the expertise and experience of our own staff provides the best teaching and learning for our children, the best use of staff time, and the best value for money.

Uniform

Don't forget to order school uniform by 15th June if you want it delivered in time for September. There is some secondhand uniform in the entrance lobby, and some uniform from Gooddies for you to find the right size. Pop in anytime, but please avoid 8.30 — 9.00am and 3.00 — 3.30pm. Please note the uniform will not be quarantined.

Gooddies or not!

Do remember that you are welcome to buy red, white, black or grey clothing from any shop – it does not have to be official uniform with the school logo.
