| Colouring Club | Staff are provided with a complimentary lunch for hosting a weekly Colouring Club as classes are not allowed to mix. | £534.60 | Sept. '20 | July '21 | Children have the option of attending and chatting to peers and staff in a relaxed environment. |
| Thrive | Each class to enjoy a weekly session to be introduced to a new extra-curricular skill/interest/hobby. | £852 | 08.03.20 | 21.07.21 | Children are reminded that learning is fun! |
| Intervention | Additional TA hours to deliver pre-teaching and/or follow-up sessions, and specific intervention programmes for children who have been identified as having a need due to missed teaching and learning during lockdowns. | £6,052 | Sept. '20 | July '21 | Individual needs are met to facilitate teaching and learning in the classroom. |
| MSA for one hour per day | TAs were originally asked to carry out a half hour lunch duty each week to facilitate each bubble being supervised in their own play space. The employment of an additional MSA released TAs back into the classroom for half an hour to deliver targeted support for identified children. | £2,392 | 07.09.20 | 21.07.21 | Individual children received focused teaching, e.g. being heard to read daily where this has not been the case during lockdown. |

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| Reading books | Due to children not being able to share resources and reading books having to be kept in each classroom, additional books from some colour bands needed to accommodate the needs of all children. | £568.63 | Spring term '21 | - | All children have a reading book that is appropriately matched to their reading ability. |
| Bug Club | Annual subscription to this online reading system that can be personalised by teachers to match individual children's needs. | £1153.99 | Spring term '21 | Spring term '22 | Children have access to high quality online texts and comprehension exercises to check understanding. |
| Phonic Phase 6 materials | As children cannot be taught in phonic sets, and such a high percentage of children have not passed the recent phonic screening, these materials, combined with pre-recorded sessions, will be used to challenge those children who passed the screening. | £97.50 | 23.11.20 | - | More able children in terms of phonic ability are provided with well-matched teaching in the classroom when human resources are stretched. |
| Power of Reading | Annual subscription for a whole-school programme to explore different texts to improve the quality of children's writing. Training webinars for staff. | £350 x 2 £65 | 12.11.20 | 11.11.21 | Following lockdown challenges of children producing good quality writing, this cohesive, intensive approach, linked to reading, provides children with language-rich opportunities to write at length. |
| Maths apparatus | Many children did not have access to concrete maths apparatus during lockdown and have missed some vital consolidation of concepts as a result. | £960.47 | Autumn '20 | - | Children have access to mathematical equipment to explore that concrete aspects of maths. |
| Clicker 8 | Word processing package to be put on 10 laptops for three years. | £900 | 07.01.21 | | Children and staff can use the package to support creative writing and SPaG. |
| NELI | Online training for a TA to take advantage of the free access to the NELI programme of language support for EYFS children. Additional TA hours to allow for the implementation of the programme and delivery of sessions. | £158.52 £1,835 | Autumn term '20 Oct. '20 | - Present- | Children in the Early Years who have missed out on vital development of communication skills due to isolation are helped to explore and improve their use of language. |

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| Hamilton Trust | Staff reimbursed for subscriptions to allow parallel teachers to plan for absolute parity when resources (human and classroom) cannot be shared and meetings are minimised. | £165 | Sept. '20 | Aug '21 | Teachers know that lessons are matched between classes, including when teaching and learning are remote. |
| Playground equipment for each class | Each class to have access to a set of playground equipment to encourage and practise physical activity, gross motor skills, and collaboration despite limited play space now the field is out of use. | £656.70 | 19.10.20 | 21.07.21 | Each class has sufficient appropriate play equipment while whole school resources (e.g. climbing equipment, are not being used due to Covid. |
